KEY PROJECT ACHIEVEMENTS



The results of the study on barriers in accessing the HIV care continuum for PLHIV and key groups are accepted for consideration in the NCC.



IC GenderDocM received funding of 10 K EURO for 400 beneficiaries from the National Health Insurance Fund for the strengthening of the HIV prevention program.



By order of the President of the Parliament, the Ministry of Justice and the Ministry of Internal Affairs it was confirmed to investigate cases of violation of the rights of drug users in accessing HIV services.



Creation of the National Association of PWUD in Moldova.
